Adam Coors was a slave in Frederick, MD, owned by Mr. Michael Roemer. Mr. Roemer was one of the founders of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Frederick. Due to this, Adam assisted in the construction of the church from 1754–1755.

Adam died in 1824, and was buried in the Lutheran church cemetery.
